



GETTING READY FOR TAX TREATY NEGOTIATIONS

VIRTUAL WORKSHOP
OECD - UN - MTC KOREA
5, 6 and 7 October 2021

Objectives: This virtual workshop will contribute to the development of technical knowledge and skills that are useful for the negotiation of tax treaties, mainly by exposing participants – through a simulated negotiation – to a range of situations, negotiation styles and policy questions they may need to address in a real negotiation. The workshop will be focused on the simulated negotiation of three articles of a tax treaty that will allow participants to understand the important interaction between treaty provisions, domestic legislation and the particular facts and economic relationship of two negotiating countries: the articles on permanent establishment, royalties and pensions.

Target audience: The workshop will be especially useful for officials from countries who are, or will be, involved in the negotiation, interpretation and/or administration of tax treaties.

Format & structure: The workshop will be delivered through videoconference (Zoom) and led by tax treaty experts from the OECD Secretariat: Mr. Edward Barret and Mr. Néstor Venegas. The workshop will be structured as follows:

- a) Each day of the workshop will be focused on one article that will be negotiated between two fictional countries: The Republic of Fredonia and The Kingdom of Utopia. The first day will cover the article on permanent establishment; the second day will cover the article on royalties; and the third day will cover the article on pensions;
- b) The first session of each day will provide participants with a brief theoretical overview of key aspects of the article which negotiation will be prepared and simulated in the following sessions;
- c) The second session of each day will be the "preparation for negotiation" session where participants will be divided into two teams using Zoom break-out rooms. Experienced negotiators will assume the role of team leaders of each team and will lead the discussion, from the perspective of one of the fictional countries, on what facts to take into account, the arguments to be deployed in negotiating the specific provisions, how to anticipate counter-arguments, etc. In this session, participants are encouraged to contribute ideas for arguments and counterarguments through discussion with the experts and the chat function.
- d) The third session of each day -so called "learn by watching" session- will provide participants with the opportunity of witnessing a live simulated negotiation of the selected articles between experienced negotiators. The simulation will use side-by-side texts on-screen, with the experts presenting arguments and counterarguments as in a real negotiation. This session will reproduce how new team members learn to negotiate in real life when they become part of a negotiating team with an experienced leader.
- e) At the end of each day of the workshop there will be time for comments and guestions.

Materials: The material on the two fictional negotiating countries will be available in advance to allow participants to become familiar with it before the workshop. The essential material for the workshop will include:

- Fictional facts of each country's economy and domestic legislation,
- Each country's model convention and,
- Two fictional conventions in force with third countries.

Participants are also recommended to complete the e-learning module "Introduction to Tax Treaties" found in the e-learning section of the KSP site. 
ANNEX 1: KSP REGISTRATION

Follow the 6 steps below to register for the KSP_{TA}:


1. Go to www.ksp-ta.org




2. Select the language of your choice
